Who should get a COVID-19 booster dose?

→ Some Pfizer and Moderna recipients, at least 6 months after their second dose

- ✓ Age 65 and older
- ✓ Age 50–65 at high risk of severe COVID-19
- ✓ Age 18+ at high risk due to medical conditions or job exposure may get a booster after assessing individual risk

→ All Johnson & Johnson recipients age 18 and older, at least 2 months after their initial shot.



Type of booster vaccine:

Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose. Some people may have a preference for the vaccine type that they originally received, and others may prefer to get a different booster. CDC's recommendations now allow for this type of mix and match dosing for booster shots.

What to know:

- Bring a photo ID and your CDC vaccination card. Wear short sleeves and a face mask.
- If you have been COVID-19 positive defer vaccination until you have recovered from the acute illness (symptoms) and criteria have been met to discontinue isolation.
- If you have been advised to quarantine due to an exposure to a positive COVID-19 case, wait until the quarantine period is finished to make an appointment.
- You will be asked to use hand sanitizer upon entering the building, complete a verbal health screening and have your temperature taken.
- There will be an observation period following COVID-19 vaccination. Individuals will wait for 15 minutes and will be released when the observation period is over.
- A parent/guardian must accompany all children aged 12-17.
